#### **Pre-Application**

# 1. Discuss plans with the home institution

- Selection Criteria, University Agreements and Fee-free or feepaying exchange.
- Choose one year/one semester.
- Check the <u>Academic</u> and English Language Requirements
- Check the <u>constructing</u> <u>your programme</u> and ensure they align with your academic goals.

#### 2. Nomination Process

Home University to provide nominated students details: name, email, start month, duration, subject area & level of study while at NU. 3. Students to receive instructions on how to apply online

#### **Post Application**



#### 1. Read Terms and Conditions

#### 4. Choose Accommodation

 You can apply for <u>accommodation</u> only after you have firmly accepted your offer.

#### 2. Accept offer

If you have received an Offer (Conditional or Unconditional) and wish to accept it, you can do so by using the Respond to Offer button on the applicant portal.

## 5. Check if you need a visa

- **One year** applicants to request a CAS letter via applicant portal
- One semester applicants to check if they need a Standard Visitor visa using <u>Check if you need a UK</u> <u>visa</u>

#### 3. Choose Modules

 Module request email will be sent to you separately.

#### 6. Apply for your visa

One year applicants: Once you receive your CAS you can apply for your Student Route VISA (if applicable). It is important to prepare your visa application in good time so you can arrive in time for your Induction.

#### 7. Enrolment email

- Students will receive an enrolment email with all the information on getting started at Northumbria.
- Information include how to enrol, pre- registration, email account, smartcard, access to blackboard, Student Portal and Right to Cancel.
- Before you arrive in the UK, you should complete pre -registration online.

- Fully <u>enrol</u> and collect your <u>smartcard</u>

- Once you have arrived at Northumbria, you will need to have your visa verified (if applicable).





### Post Completion of Study

- 1. Receive unofficial transcript
- Semester one students to receive unofficial transcripts in March.

  - Send to admissions team to sign.

# 2. Receive official transcript

All students receive official transcript in July.



## **Application Procedure Information**

- Partner institution to send nomination details by email (name, email, start month, duration, subject area & level of study while at NU) to <u>bc.exchangeapplicantservices@northumbria.ac.uk</u>
- Each nominated student will receive individual email instructions on how to apply online and partner institution will be copied into the email.
- Students to complete online application and submit all supporting documents (i.e.: passport, English qualification, recent academic transcript and if required, a portfolio).

Please note we cannot make certain courses changes after enrolment due to module and timetabling constraints. If you do wish to switch courses, this must be agreed with your home institution as soon as possible.
